



About four months ago we heard of a mysterious virus that was causing pneumonia like symptoms and today, much of the world as we know it has come to a standstill. More than 4 billion people around the world are in some form of lockdown due to the Corona virus pandemic. The lockdown will be over one day, and time will come to rejoin our work, but given the nature of the pandemic, everything is about to change. Once the lockdown ends, we will need to take a series of steps to ensure that the employees are safe and active to restart the routine activities. There have to be well thought out efforts to ensure that while we open up our institute/offices, we take every step possible to minimize the impact on

employees and visitors and ensure their well being and safety, include starting from home to going back safely.

To facilitate this change, our COVID-19 Task Team of Corona Warriors, under guidance of worthy Principal Sir, has worked out detailed Guidelines and Standard Operating Procedure for safe start of operations in the institute. Each element of this plan integrates OUR SAFETY at the core. Guidelines include starting from home to going back safely. These guidelines will be periodically updated by the institute, guidance based on current recommendations from the Centres for Disease Control and Prevention and the World Health Organization, Centre/ State Governments, MHRD, AICTE, IKG PTU and Local Administration.

Frame work to restart Operations after Lock down:

- 1. **Management Level**: a). Policies for Pandemic recovery, b). Structured Organization, c). Exercise, Test and Maintaining Quality, d). Sufficient Stock of Mask, Disposable Gloves, shoes cover/disposable rubber boots, Disinfectants and Sanitizers along with required equipments, infrastructure and facilities e). Modification in existing infrastructure like distancing in sitting arrangement inside classrooms and Laboratories, use of sensor/push doors, sensor based taps in washing area and water coolers to avoid physical contact.
- 2. **Sanitization, Disinfection and Disposal**: a) Regular sanitization and disinfection b). Supervision, Checking Quality of Sanitization and Disinfection (both process and material) c). Use of Closed Waste Bins d). Waste segregation and disposal.
- 3. **Entry Gate**: a). Screening and Temperature Testing of every Staff, Student and Visitor b) Record of all incoming Raw Material and Visitors c). Hand Washing and sanitization d). Social distancing e). Self Declaration / Record Personal information and issue Visitor Pass.
- 4. Offices / Admission Cell / Examination Hall / Fee counter / Classroom & Labs / Library: a) Follow Social distancing b). Be in queue, wait for your turn in the waiting room c) Use of Air Conditioners and Ventilation.
- 5. **Mess / Canteen**: a) Follow Social distancing b). Be in queue; wait for your turn in the waiting room c). Food Serving at a distance d) Wear mask and Hood by serving personals e). Disinfection of Raw Materials and Utensils. f) Cleanliness.
- 6. **Emergency Response Team**: a). Crisis Communication / Contact to Designated local Hospital for Corona treatment b). Succession Plan
- 7. **Notice Boards and Website / Display**: a).DAVIET, Jalandhar, Policy document: The Environment and Health Policy and Visitor Policy, Advisories,

Guidelines and policies issued by Central and State Authorities and Regulatory Bodies b) Pamphlets, Poster and Standees

8. **Training and awareness of all stake Holders**: a). Special Training of Security and Cleaning Staff, b). General Training of all employees and students regarding strategy and implementation.

Guiding principles after Covid-19 Lockdown and visitor policy:

- i. A detailed planning activity, where we need to identify which employees really need to come to work, even after the lockdown is lifted. Others can continue to work from home. That clarity is important.
- ii. We have to ensure there is no crowding in our office or campus, ensure that only 25 to 50% of the workspace is actually made operational / occupied.
- iii. Vehicle entry should be strictly restricted in the campus. Vehicle of all the employees and visitors must be parked outside.
- iv. Everybody whosoever enter in the institute must wear a three-layered Mask and follow the Government guidelines on how to wear mask and use of Aarogya Setu app may be made mandatory.
- v. Hand Wash before entry at main Gate; Sensor base tap be used along with elbow pressed liquid soap holder. Wash the hands with soap for at least 20-40 seconds by applying the soap gently on the palm and back of the hand including web spaces between the fingers and space as well as between the finger and the thumb and the wrist wherever and whenever the opportunity to wash the hands is available. However, a two-hourly hand wash is recommended. The hands should be either sanitized or washed with soap and water whichever is feasible and available. Sanitize the hands even if the hands appear to be apparently clean.
- vi. For screening and monitoring, it has been recommended for mandatory usage of Aarogya Setu app by all, Thermal scanning at the entrance must be insured by installing a fever scanning metal detector door / thermal imaging screen. Infrared forehead thermometers may also be provided at each hostel entrance and residents be checked while entering and going out without fail.
- vii. Alcohol-based sanitizer (80% ethyl alcohol v/v + hydrogen peroxide(H_2O_2) and glycerine or isopropyl alcohol, hydrogen peroxide(H_2O_2) and glycerine) be mounted at the entrance wall of the institute/office for the staff, students, and visitors to sanitize their hands before entering the premises further.

The sanitizers are to be refilled / replaced frequently. Use a minimum of 3ml of the sanitizer (approximately 1 push of sanitizer dispenser) on DRY HANDS for at least 30 seconds for good hygienic hand disinfection.

- viii. use of sensor/ push doors, sensor base taps in washing area and water coolers to avoid physical contact and providing disposal glasses at all the location of drinking area is highly recommended.
- ix. Make hand wash a habit and fun not a choice under compulsion. Wash your hands every time you end up touching a doorknob or press the lift buttons or any common surface with your bare hands. Avoid lifts and take the staircase instead. If you need to touch the railing for support, be sure to wash your hands with soap and water as soon as you reach the office even before you set your bag down at the desk. Don't hug or shake hands with anyone. Come up with your own preferred greeting like a Namaste. Don't wear belt, rings, wrist watch, when you go out. Watch is not required. Your mobile has got time.
- x. The staff shall be advised not to roam unnecessarily in the office and to work from their allotted space only. Use of personal cell phone, intercoms / electronic media for interpersonal communication of the staff be encouraged.
- xi. Wipe down your desk, mouse, keyboard and screen daily at least two times with a paper towel and alcohol based sanitizer before you start working. Take a break from your screen every 20 minutes for 20 seconds so you don't feel the need to rub your eyes.
- xii. Avoid using shared cutlery if you really need to use common cutlery, try to wash it yourself.

xiii Disinfection of the Campus:

a. Indoor Areas:

Indoor areas including office spaces and conference rooms and facility room should be cleaned every evening after office hours and/or early in the morning before the rooms are occupied. If the contact surface is visibly dirty, it should be cleaned with soap and water prior to disinfection.

* Prior to cleaning, the cleaner should wear disposable rubber boots/shoes cover, gloves (heavy duty), and a cloth mask. Special precautions should be followed by person doing disinfection such as wearing gloves, disposable rubber boots/shoes cover and making sure they have good ventilation during use of the product. Open outside doors

and windows to increase air circulation in the area and then begin cleaning and disinfection. Start cleaning from cleaner areas and proceed towards dirtier areas.

- All indoor areas such as entrance lobbies, corridors and staircases, escalators, elevators, security guard booths, office rooms, Class rooms, Laboratories, Library, Examination Hall meeting rooms, cafeteria, Mess, Hostel Rooms should be mopped with a disinfectant with 1% sodium hypochlorite or equivalent disinfectants commercially available in the market
- High contact surfaces such as elevator buttons, handrails / handles and call buttons, escalator handrails, public counters, intercom systems, equipment like telephone, printers/scanners, and other office machines should be cleaned twice daily by mopping with a linen/absorbable cloth soaked in 1% sodium hypochlorite. Frequently touched areas like table tops, chair handles, pens, diary files, keyboards, mouse, mouse pad, tea/coffee dispensing machines etc. should specially be cleaned.
- For metallic surfaces like door handles, security locks, keys etc. 70% alcohol can be used to wipe down surfaces where the use of bleach is not suitable.
- Hand sanitizing stations should be installed in office premises and near high contact surfaces.
- In a meeting/conference/office room, if someone is coughing, without following respiratory etiquettes or mask, the areas around his/her seat should be vacated and cleaned with 1% sodium hypochlorite.
 - Carefully clean the equipment used in cleaning at the end of the cleaning process.
- Protective gear used during sanitation process should be discarded as per the requirements. In addition, all employees should consider cleaning the work area in front of them with a disinfecting wipe prior to use and sit one seat further away from others and if possible 2 seats.

b. Outdoor areas:

Outdoor Areas have less risk then indoor areas due to air currents and exposure to sunlight. Cleaning and disinfection efforts should be targeted to frequently touched/contaminated surfaces as already detailed above.

C. Office/Public toilets:

Sanitary workers must use separate set of cleaning equipment for toilets (mops, nylon scrubber) and separate set for sink and commode. They should always wear disposable protective gloves while cleaning a toilet. All the areas of the toilet such as the sinks, commode, taps etc. should be thoroughly cleaned/scrubbed using soap and water

and then wiped with 1% sodium hypochlorite solution or equivalent commercial disinfectants available in the market.

d. Pantry in the office:

Office Pantryshould also be cleaned as the other inside office spaces. Special care needs to be taken while cleaning the slabs and the sinks, if any with soap/detergent and water. The utensils should be properly cleaned with dish wash bars /liquids and water. The utensils should not be shared amongst the staff. Consumption of raw fruits/vegetables during refreshment period should be discouraged and the same shall be washed with lukewarm water before consumption. Similarly, the milk packets shall be washed with soap and water before opening the same for usage.

- xiv. **Distancing at work**: Ensure that there is a space of six feet between all seats. The lockdown may be over but that does not mean that there is no need for social/physical distancing anymore. You spend 8-9 hours at work and must maintain a proper distance from everyone during this time, whether they seem fine or not. There are no exceptions to this rule
- xv. **Personal Protection and safety kit**: Prepare your personal kit before you step out it must include a face cover, hand sanitizer, hand soap, gloves, toilet seat sanitizer and tissue papers and water bottle. Wear the face cover as much as possible not for filtering but it'll keep you from touching your face too often. Use a hand sanitizer whenever you can't wash your hands. Carry hand soap in a small bottle. Use gloves for whenever you need to be dealing with shared items like the exchange of files or the office phone. Uses a toilet seat sanitizer before and after you use the shared toilet. You can even use it on the tap and the flush. Carry tissue papers to sneeze or cough into, to dry your hands and to turn off the sink tap. Don't bring the shoes into your house. Leave them outside.
- xvi. **Go Digital**: Save paper as well as the risk of coming in contact with papers that other people may have handled. Scan and send important documents instead of moving files. Keep a digital signature ready for a situation that may require it.
- xvii. **Commuting to work**: Wear a face cover and gloves if you travel in public transport. If possible, use a digital wallet to make all payments instead of dealing cash. Wash your hands as soon as you reach home or office.
- xviii. **Working in shifts**: Institute should function in shifts to follow social distancing. Employees to be divided in shifts and alternate day rosters with staggered shift start and end timings, no overlap between shifts providing a cushion of almost 1 hour for disinfection.

The institute should encourage the staff to stay at home in case of any fever or other symptoms related to the COVID-19 and seek medical advice. Staff detected with

high fever in the office premises does not mandatorily mean that he/she is suffering from COVID-19. It is advised to get the staff suffering from high fever medically examined by the medical officer only by temporarily isolating him/her from the rest of the office space before drawing any conclusion/inferences and before sending him/her back to home.

Xix Duties of the employees:

- a) An employee suffering from high fever/cough/sneezing/difficulty in breathing should voluntarily report the same to employer as well as seek immediate medical advice for timely detection and treatment.
- b) The employee should meticulously sanitize his hands in the manner prescribed above and hand wash with soap in the manner prescribed at least every 2 hours.
- c) The employee should wear masks at all times and should follow the reporting time as well as the time to leave the office as prescribed by the institute.
- d) The employee should not indulge in handshake/hug with fellow employees and should discharge his/her work from the space allocated by the authority.
- e) The employee should mandatorily hand wash/sanitize in the manner prescribed before touching the refreshments during tea-break/lunchbreak etc.
- f) The employee should avoid roaming without purpose in the office as also touching the surfaces, equipment etc. The employee should not smoke or chew tobacco-based products such as gutka, pan masala etc. in the office space.
- g) In case of a cough/sneeze, the employee should use the handkerchief to cover the space which shall then be kept in his/her own pocket/purse in a manner that the surface of the handkerchief exposed to the cough/sneeze shall not touch the other parts of the belongings directly.
- h) In case an employee is not carrying the handkerchief he/she should cough/sneeze into the flexed elbow.
- i) In either case, the employee should immediately hand wash with soap in the manner prescribed his hands/other exposed surfaces to cough/sneeze.
- j) The employee should refrain from touching face, mouth, nose and eyes with his hands at all times.

- k) The employee should not spit except when absolutely essential and only in the washbasin of the toilet in the office space.
- xx. Training of staff and students and instructions for visitors.
 - xxi. For visitors meeting zone for all purposes should be conference room, no one should visit to personal cabin.
 - xxii. Display of instructions for maintaining social distancing, hygiene and employee safety and instructions for visitors, on the institute Website and campaign through social media and display within the campus in the form of Posters and standees.

Restart Manual to resume operations in institute post corona virus lockdown

Or

Standard Operating Procedures for resuming operations post-lockdown.

To ensure the safety for self, safety of colleagues, safety at workplace and safety for community. The proposed action plan for resuming operations post COVID-19 and standard operating procedure (SOP), on maintaining social distancing, hygiene and employee safety. The salient features of the post lock down -COVID-19 strategies are:-

- A) Safety for self, Safe at Home, Safe for family, Safe in Transit, Safety of Colleagues, Safe at Workplace and Safe for Community are the key concepts to fight COVID19. Under such a situation, the national policy and government guidelines issued from time to time are to be followed one and all including all the stake holders, progressively resuming operations in a graded manner. However, post lockdown we must continue to take all necessary precautions for a much longer duration. Aspects like Social distancing' and hygiene will have to be integrated into our lifestyle.
- B) For social distancing, the institute will be working in shifts, with minimal not more than 25% manpower in particular shift.

- C) There will be markings at all crowd gathering places to facilitate social distancing like entry gate, reception, admission desk, fee counter, examination hall, class room, Labs, Library, hostel, canteen, mess etc.
- D) For screening and monitoring, it has been recommended for usage of Aarogya Setu app by all and continuous monitoring of staff and student's health through an in-house developed app is highly recommended as it shall be easier to maintain the data of staff as well as visitors.
- E) Thermal scanning is mandatory (noncontact body temperature scanning). For Hand Wash before entry at main Gate; Sensor base tap be used along with elbow pressed liquid soap holder.
- F) There will be regular sanitization of all common / large areas and touch prone areas along with disinfection.
- G) Wearing three layered/standard Mask is compulsory to enter the campus.
- H) There will not be more than 25% office employees at any given point of time.
 - I) Employees to be divided in shifts and alternate day rosters with staggered shift start and end timings, no overlap between shifts providing a cushion of almost 1 hour for disinfection.
 - J) The social distancing markings should be laid out to ensure a distance of at least 2 meters (about two arm's length) from other person at all crowd prone areas like entry gate, water coolers, canteens, reception, admission desk, fee counter, examination hall, class room, Labs, Library, hostel, mess etc.
 - K) It is mandated for thermal screening at entrance. For screening and monitoring, it has been recommended for mandatory usage of Aarogya Setu app by all. Thermal scanning at the entrance must be insured by installing a fever scanning metal detector door / thermal imaging screen. Infrared forehead thermometers may also be provided at each hostel entrance and residents be checked while entering and going out without fail.

- L) There should be decontamination of common use areas in every shift. There will be frequent disinfection / sanitization of all touch points.
- M) Use of self-transport is highly recommended. If using a 2-wheeler, wear proper gear including helmet and gloves. For refueling, use e-Payments. Employee may be asked to avoid car-pooling, if no option then not more than 2 people in one car.
- N) Preferably, avoid public transport, avoid physical meetings. If unavoidable, attendees to follow social distancing norms, meeting rooms should be properly disinterested before the meetings, no handshakes, greet your hands in Namaste. Define your chair, don't use anyone else's chair, don't share food or snacks on the desks, keep sanitizing/washing your hands every few hours and sanitize your laptops, mobiles, and desks twice daily.
- O) Use of Air Conditioners: Temperature Range 24-30°C, Humidity level 40-70%, keep at least one window open for proper ventilation, keep one pan full of water.

P) Coordinate with local health officials

Local health officials' recommendations for the duration and extent of class suspensions, building and facility closures, and event and activity cancellations should be made on a case-by-case basis using the most up-to-date information about COVID-19. These officials will help administrator to determine a course of action to determine when to return to campus. Coordinate with local health officials is very crucial to communicate dismissal decisions and the possible COVID-19 exposure risk.

- Q) Review, update, and implement emergency operations plans (EOPs):-This should be done in collaboration with local public health departments, Institute's university system and other regulating/affiliating agencies.
 - Consider if and how to honour requests of students or staff who may have concerns about being on campus due to underlying medical conditions or those of others in their home

- Alert local health officials about large increases in student, staff, and faculty absenteeism or substantial increases in institute health centre traffic due to respiratory illnesses (like the symptoms similar to symptoms of COVID-19).
- R) The students with history of chronic diseases i.e. diabetes, asthma chronic, hemophilia, major post surgery etc. may be given special priority and may be exempted from physical attendance as far as possible.


S) Implement social distancing strategies inside the classrooms and Labs:

Increase space between desks. Where possible, rearrange desks to maximize the space between students. Turn desks to face in the same direction (rather than facing each other) to reduce transmission caused from virus-containing droplets (e.g., from talking, coughing, sneezing). Fixed sitting arrangement of students be practiced.

T) Visitor Policy:

- i. No meeting at personal cabin is allowed, only in conference Hall.
- ii. Admission seeker should accompany minimum no of persons with them.
- iii. All visitors must follow the guidelines on social distancing and personal hygiene.
- iv. All visitors should get them thermally screened and sanitized at the entrance.
- v. All visitors must provide the information regarding self declarationi.e. Medical history, contact details, person whom to Meet with purpose.
- vi. Spitting is strictly prohibited and banned, punishable as per norms.
- vii. Visitor should meet to the concerned person in conference hall and don't roam in campus.
 - 1. The vendors and service provider must have prior appointment before visiting the institute.
 - 2. The visitor must report to Institute Reception and should wait there in the waiting lounge and have patience till asked to proceed further.
 - **3.** The visitors will follow the fixed path as detailed below:

Main Gate to Reception via the path arrow marked i.e. towards Guest House to Material Block to C Hall to R&D Block.







Tribute to Martyr of Pulwama Attack:

The Pulwama attack occurred on 14 February 2019, when a convoy of vehicles carrying Indian security personnel on the Jammu–Srinagar National Highway was attacked by a vehicle-borne suicide bomber at Lethapora in the Pulwama district of the erstwhile state of Jammu and Kashmir. The attack killed 40 Indian Central Reserve Police Force (CRPF) personnel as well as the perpetrator—Adil Ahmad Dar—who was a local Kashmiri youth from the Pulwama district. The responsibility for the attack was claimed by the Pakistan-based Islamist terrorist group, Jaish-e-Mohammed.India blamed neighbouring Pakistan for the attack, while the latter condemned the attack and denied having any connections to it. The day was marked as the Black Day of India and every year, the countrymen pay their tribute to the lost soldiers on 14th February.


DAVIET has given tribute to martyr of Pulwama attack by organising Sardhanjli to the Martyrs, group discussions, Extempore etc. in the classes.

A DRUG DE-ADDICTION SEMINAR "SAY NO TO DRUGS" ORGANIZED AT DAVIET ON 03rd May 2022



A Drug de-addiction seminar "Say No to Drugs" was organized by the NSS unit of DAVIET here on the Institute campus in association with NGO Dishadeep, Nishkaam Sewa Society and District Red Cross Society Jalandhar under the Institute Social Responsibility Initiative. The deaddiction seminar aimed to educate the youth about the ill effects of drug abuse and to provide them with information about the means and ways to prevent it.

Dr Ashok Kumar NSS coordinator delivered the welcome address. He stated that the NSS unit of the Institution is committed to enlightening and empowering the youth of the region to stay away from the menace of drug abuse.

Dr Manoj Kumar, Principal DAVIET appreciated the dedication of Dishadeep and Bharat Vikas Parishad to rid the society of social ills. He shared that recent studies show that 88% of heroin addicts in India are in the age group of 14-25 years. He stated that there is a need of raising the level of consciousness of the self through proper education so that the menace can be tackled head-on.

Dr Sanjeev Lochan Bakshi, Senior Resident (Psychiatrist), Civil Hospital Phagwara was the Key Note Speaker. She shared that 190 million people have attempted drugs worldwide. She elaborated that drug addiction implies physical dependence upon a drug including the development of tolerance and withdrawal. If the addict is not allowed to take the drug he suffers from painful and uncontrollable convulsions, vomiting, depression and various other maladies. She elaborated that the desire to experiment and to have a thrill are the prime reasons for drug abuse. She listed four major drugs in Punjab namely Opium, Alcohol, Tobacco and Cannabis. She also shared that 50 % of urban heroin addicts come from a single-parent families. She educated the students that drug abuse leads to Psychotic Disorder, Mood Disorder, Anxiety Disorder and Amnestic Disorder which can affect the life of an individual a lot.

Mr Ashok Kumar, Assistant Commissioner of Police Jalandhar was the chief Guest. He stated that the future of the nation is bright because of the dynamic and exuberant youth. He also cautioned that the young need to be disciplined and dedicated to realise their dreams and stay away from drugs. He urged the students and the public, in general, to cooperate with the police so that the culprits can be nabbed.

Ms. Kiran Nagpal, President of Nishkam Sewa Society delivered the Vote of Thanks.







The Constitution of India is the supreme law of India. Parliament of India can not make any law which violates the Fundamental Rights enumerated under the Part III of the Constitution. The Parliament of India has been empowered to amend the Constitution under Article 368, however, it cannot use this power to change the "basic structure" of the constitution, which has been ruled and explained by the Supreme Court of India in its historical judgments. The Constitution of India reflects the idea of "Constitutionalism" – a modern and progressive concept historically developed by the thinkers of "liberalism" – an ideology which has been recognized as one of the most popular political ideology and result of historical struggles against arbitrary use of sovereign power by state. The historic revolutions in France, England, America and particularly European Renaissance and Reformation movement have resulted into progressive legal reforms in the form of "constitutionalism" in many countries. 




DAVIET presented Influential Women Awards


